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President's Message

Towards obtaining a better outcome in Burns.

Thank you all for giving me the opportunity to be the President of our esteemed organization. Leadership is responsible for providing the path to what the organization stands for. Having been at the helm of affairs in various professional bodies, I found that being the President of NABI is exciting and challenging.

Exciting because, you are leading an organization which represents the burn care professionals of the country and not people belonging to one speciality. You get a different perspectives to any issue and that makes it vibrant.

Challenging because we have a long way to go in raising the average level of available burn care in the country. Richard Smith, an Hand Surgeon from Boston said, that 'Today's patient must get the best that today has to offer'. It is a great goal to aim because it does not state the best that we can offer. We have to compare our outcomes with the best that is possible today elsewhere. If we use that yardstick, we will find that the LD 50 scores of all our units will be way far from the best that is possible. Perhaps acute burn care is the only surgical field where there is very wide gap between the best possible in the

world and the best possible in India. That must make us ponder. While we have at least some centres to match up with the best in the world in hand replants and transplants, complex cardiac, neuro or laparoscopic procedures, we are yet to gain that ground in acute burn care. Personally I feel convinced that if we practice the same protocols and the best practices as done in such units we should also get the same results.

I think for that we need to have a change in perspective. It has to start within. First I think we need to make our Government feel that burn care is labour and resource intensive. The CGHS rates recommended for burn care reflects the impact we have made on the Government and the people. A 50 per cent burn dressing is sanctioned a few hindered rupees and surgery for that burn a few thousand rupees. Government insurance schemes do sanction 18 to 20 lakhs for a liver transplant. I personally feel that to make a 50 % full thickness deep burn to survive it takes as much effort, labour and skill as performing a liver transplant. Government and the insurance companies also work on the basis of information and perceptions they get from professional groups. Our collective goal must be to make them consider revising the rates. The poor numbers reflect the interest in the care of the burn patient and the respect to the burn care professional and the specialty.

The burn care outcomes are poised to jump with the advent of newer skin substitutes and widespread starting of skin banks. This has the potential to change the outcomes for the better. But by themselves they can't make the difference. Ultimately, it will be in the hands of the person who uses them. Otherwise, it will be a lot of good money down the drain. This calls for training opportunities and getting bright young people into the specialty. The bright young person has also a choice. To make a person choose burns when he / she has a choice, economics will play the final card. Good outcomes, good recognition by the society and the peers are important. There will rest the future of burn care in the country.

On another note, we also need to run NABI as an organization efficiently. All professional bodies now have many compliance norms to adhere. Cost of non-compliance is much more than the effort and cost of compliance. It is the duty of the present and the future leaders of the executive, to leave a robust organization to the future generation. We have done some baby steps in this regard and that should be the priority for the future.

I also thank Drs Veena and team for conducting the online educational activities. I had the pleasure of being at AIIMS, Bibinagar, Telangana for a CME on Burns organized by Dr Rohit Mula. It was a great meeting and it was wonderful to listen to the voices of senior people like Dr GV Sudhakar, Dr Lakshmi Palukari and Dr Bharatendu Swain and the ideas of young people during the breaks.

Growth also occurs when you meet personally and exchange ideas and foster friendship. Our yearly NABICONS are just the right occasions. Dr Vijayakumar and his team are taking great efforts to give us a conference to remember. Let us meet at Ayodhya from the 13th to 15th February, 2025.

It is also our proud privilege that we have our Dr Vinita Puri as the President of the Asian Pacific Burn Association and India would be hosting the 2025 congress at Goa from the 21st to 24th of August, 2025. Let us showcase to the world the work we do and shower Indian Hospitality on our visitors by attending the Asian Pacific Congress in great numbers.

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Secretary's Message

This year we lost a doyen of Burn care, Dr. J. L. Gupta. A person who had steadfastly worked towards improving Burn Care in India, must have had reasonable satisfaction that the nation has come a long way long in that direction. A National Program on Burns was started and numerous burn centers & skin banks opened up across the country and most importantly the private sector taking a significant share of burn admissions. With many governments run insurance schemes like Ayushman Bharat, a lot of poor patients can now avail basic treatment of burns in the private sector as well.

But he must have also had feeling that “miles I must travel before I rest”. The prevention aspect still needs to be strengthened. At the Center, the National Program had rolled out an effective prevention strategy but health being a State subject, the implementation was to be at the state level. We as NABI members have the responsibility of sensitizing our respective state governments in this aspect. Also, we must collaborate with our community medicine colleagues to further the prevention strategies in their field practice areas.

Another aspect which needs more attention is research in burns. Members in Medical Education Institutes must promote thesis topics in burns and apply for extramural funding for research in burns.

The exclusive national program for burns i.e National Program for Prevention and Management of Burn Injuries has got subsumed in National Program for Prevention and Management of Trauma and Burn Injuries. Now it's even more important to keep our focus of the prevention part by appraising the government regarding the disease burden and changing dynamics of burn injuries. For that we must provide epidemiological data to the policy makers. Recently the ICMR Burn Task Force Study: a Multicenter Community based Prevalence Study, was a step in that direction.

On the organizational aspect of NABI, we can take pride that we have grown. Since 2018, after I held the position of Secretary, 202 new members have joined the Association. But I must say the membership is mostly taken by plastic surgeons and it is imperative that we make efforts to encourage our general surgeon colleagues and nurses to take membership of NABI. On the financial aspect during the last General Body Meeting, some important decisions were taken by restructuring the funds and awards. It's definitely a welcome step. In years to come we must aim to be financially strong and for that we must apply for 80G and aim for CSR registration.

NABICON 2025 is being organized in the holy city of Ayodhya. I appeal to all members to attend the conference, which I feel is going to be a landmark event.

At the end I must thank the August Body in bestowing on me the responsibility of Secretary, which I held for two consecutive terms. It was a fruitful experience for me. I extend my sincere gratitude to my predecessor Dr. Sujata Sarabahi, Dr. Shardendu Sharma, past Treasurer and Dr. Piyush Tayal, Treasurer for their help in running the affairs of the Association. It has been my privilege to have worked under eminent Presidents, Dr A K Singh, Dr Vinita Puri, Dr Sanjeev Uppal, Dr R K Srivastava, Dr Anant Sinha, Dr S Raja Sabapathy, their guidance and wisdom was invaluable during my tenure as Secretary. I will always be indebted to Dr. S. P. Bajaj for his constant support and Dr. R. B. Ahuja for mentoring me.

I will always remain a committed foot soldier of the Association in years to come.





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The effective changes are to be put up to the executive body and later in GBM.

Some suggestions:

1. Each past president must hold one burn awareness meeting in a year and attend at least one zonal meeting for prevention and to promote good burn care.
2. Instead of one midterm CME, it would be advisable to have three to four (or even five) zonal meetings for better communication. The target should be young factors, final year students, and medical officers.

Each zonal meeting should be supported by Rs 50 thousand as an advance/seed money (to be returned within 3 months of the event)to prepare properly.

3. Advocacy cell. To be in touch with the government policies and how best to implement themDr Rajiv Ahuja, and office bearers.

4. Definite training program for paramedics. This will be combined with the zonal workshops

5. The executive members should be actively involved in CMEs, paramedic training programs, and above all, increase membership drive (to add five members every year)

Independent Auditor's Report

To The Members
NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BURNS-INDIA

Report on Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of **NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BURNS-INDIA** ("the Trust"), which comprise of the Balance Sheet as at **31st March 2024** and the Statement of Income and Expenditure Account (hereinafter referred to as the Financial Statements) for the year then ended, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

The Board of Trustees/Executive Committee is responsible for the matters with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the Trust, in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified by ICAI. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Trust and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements, based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing as applicable to the Trust. Those standards require that we comply with the ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Trust's preparation of the financial statements that give true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances.



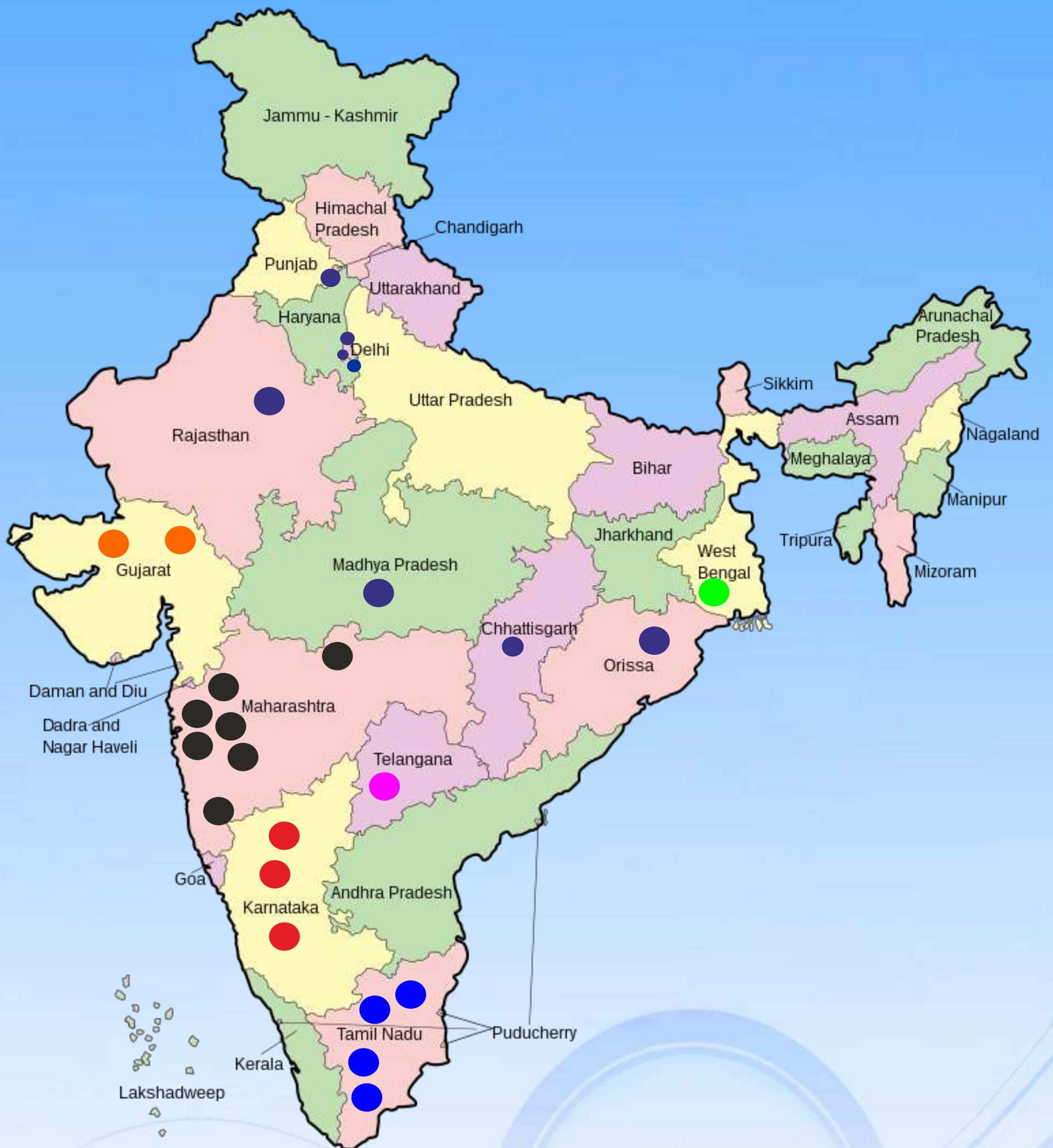

जलना क्या है

जलना एक चोट या दुर्घटना है जो आग, गर्म तरल पदार्थ, बिजली, गर्म भाप, गर्म धुआँ, गर्म धातु, पटाखे व विस्फोटक सामान आदि कारणों से हो सकती है। जलने से चमड़ी, मांस पेशियां, कोशिकाएं, नसें इत्यादि भी क्षतिग्रस्त हो सकती हैं। जलने से गंभीर पीड़ा के अलावा शारीरिक विकृति, मानसिक एवं भावनात्मक परिणाम भी हो सकते हैं।

जलने के कारण



स्टोव- आमतौर पर स्टोव फटने से व तेल लीक होने से आग लग सकती है।



सिलेण्डर- गैस पाइप के कटे-फटे होने और रेग्युलेटर के ठीक से फिट न होने के कारण गैस सिलेण्डर के फटने से आग लग सकती है।



डिबरी- खाली शीशी/डिब्बी में तेल और बत्ती डालकर घर में बनी डिबरी आग लगने का आम कारण है।



गर्म तरल पदार्थ से जलना- गर्म चाय/उबलता पानी/तेल/दूध/सूप आदि।



गर्म भाप- प्रेशर कुकर की भाप/बायलर से निकलने वाली भाप/भाप लेने वाली मशीन आदि।



बिजली- दोषपूर्ण तार, ढीले कनेक्शन/बिजली के खुले पाइंट या स्विच आदि।



रसायनों के कारण- रसायनिक कारखानों, विद्यालयों की प्रयोगशालाएं आदि।



गर्म धातु- प्रैस/कढ़ाई/पतीला आदि गलती से छूने पर त्वचा जल सकती है।

जलने से बचाव - घर में

स्टोव व गैस के चूल्हे का सही रख-रखाव



- हमेशा आई.एस.आई. मार्क वाले स्टोव/गैस चूल्हा प्रयोग करें।
- गैस सिलेण्डर को हमेशा सीधी स्थिति में खड़ा रखें।
- रबड़ की ट्यूब हर 3 से 4 माह में बदलें।
- ट्यूब का किनारा यदि खराब हो जाए तो उसे काट कर पुनः इस्तेमाल करें।
- गैस के चूल्हे का उपयोग नह हो तो रेगुलेटर बंद रखें।
- गैस के बर्नर की नियमित सफाई करें।

रोशनी के स्थानीय उपकरणों का ध्यान रखें

कभी भी रोशनी के लिए खतरनाक उपकरणों जैसे दीया आदि का प्रयोग न करें क्योंकि इनसे आग लगने का खतरा रहता है।



हमेशा लैम्प, दीया, मोमबत्ती, लालटेन आदि को बच्चों की पहुँच से दूर, ऊँचाई पर रखें।

ज्वलनशील पदार्थ जैसे मिट्टी का तेल, माचिस इत्यादि जलते हुए लैम्प से दूर रखें।



नियमित रूप से लैम्प/लालटेन की सफाई एवं रख-रखाव करें।

हमेशा रोशनी करने वाले सभी उपकरण जैसे लैम्प, दीया आदि को पर्दों से दूर रखें।



जलने से रहें सावधान

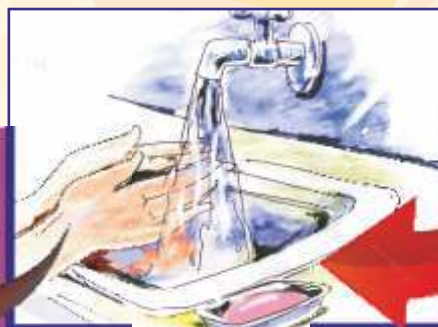

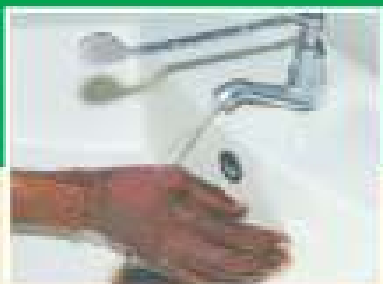

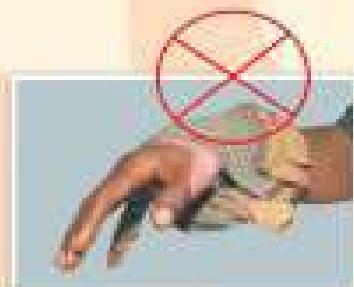

BURN PREVENTION AT HOME

Do's



- Always keep the cooking stove on a raised platform.
- Keep Matches/ Candles/ *Diya*/ Inflammables out of reach of children.
- Check temperature of the water for bath especially in case of children.
- Unplug all electrical gadgets when not in use and put off the switches.
- Use only ISI marked standard quality electric wires.

Don'ts



- ❌ Do not wear synthetic, overhanging/ loose clothes while cooking.
- ❌ Do not let children play with electric gadgets matches, candles, lamps, fire etc.
- ❌ Do not hold a child while smoking/ drinking hot liquids
- ❌ Do not overload electric sockets.
- ❌ Do not smoke in bed.
- ❌ Do not throw a burning Bidi/ Cigarette anywhere.
- ❌ Do not sleep in the room with Electric Heaters/ Lamps, Candles on.

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BURN PREVENTION DURING FESTIVALS/ CEREMONIES

Do's

- Light fireworks/ crackers only in open grounds/ outdoors.
- Buy good quality fireworks from authorized dealers only.
- Light only one firework at a time and watch from a safe distance.
- Keep 2 buckets of water and / or sand ready while igniting fireworks.
- Children should light fireworks only in the presence of elders.



Don'ts



- ⊘ Never use fireworks inside the house.
- ⊘ Do not ignite fireworks while holding them in your hand.
- ⊘ Do not bend on an ignited firecracker.
- ⊘ Do not touch a misfired or half-burnt cracker.
- ⊘ Do not allow small children to handle fireworks/ cracker.

- ⊘ Do not burn fireworks while pointing at other people.
- ⊘ Do not light firecracker in narrow lanes.



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
